 - Faculty who use an LMS as a key environment for learning in flipped or hybrid courses
 - o Faculty who use an LMS primarily to support in-person courses
- Faculty willing to support peers in creating accessible, supportive LMS environments that enable online, hybrid, and/or in-person learning

Mentor Responsibilities for Spring 2024 (3-5 hours/week):

- Complete training in online learning environment design, peer mentoring strategies, and the new LMS

- Develop, share, and pilot an exemplary course in the LMS
- Advise and support faculty in LMS migration & effective LMS use
- Provide helpful feedback by reviewing mentees' course sites
- Direct mentees to training materials and collaborate on workshops
- Troubleshoot issues and brainstorm solutions to LMS challenges
